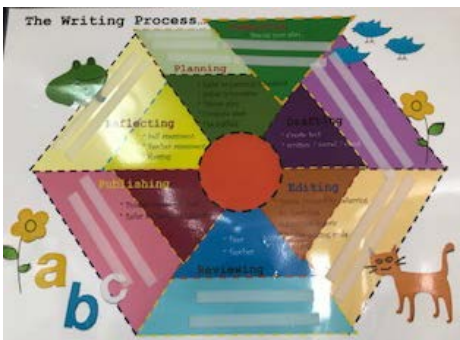

The Writing Process explained

All students should use this process in their writing. Please talk to your children about this process. Every classroom display and use this poster.



Plan – plan ideas generation of ideas and selection of one or more of these ideas with consideration of the purpose for writing and the audience.

Compose – requires the writer to go from their ideas to the message they want to convey. It is then necessary to choose words and sentences to convey the message. When

composing, students in the early years need to be shown how spoken language becomes written language and the differences between them.

Drafting – writing process where writers record the ideas and messages they want to convey. It is the recording of messages that enables communication through writing and involves using the conventions of written language so that texts can be read by others.

- Concepts about print
- Spelling
- Grammar
- Punctuation
- Handwriting and keyboarding

Revise – where writers improve and enhance their writing by adding or deleting words or sentences. They need to reread it to make it better.

Edit – Students fix spelling, punctuation.

Publish – for an audience/purpose preparation of a text for presentation to an audience

Adult tickets are \$5 and children between the ages of 3 to 16 are \$2.

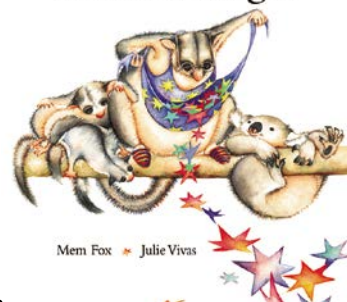
Hurry, tickets are selling out quickly!
